



Getting Started

Important! Do not insert or remove peripherals or memory cards once power is turned on. You will need a memory card in MEMORY CARD slot 1 to save your games.


- Set up your PlayStation* game console according to the instructions in its Instruction Manual.
- 2. Make sure the power is OFF before inserting or removing a compact disc.
- 3. Insert the Atari Anniversary Edition Redux disc and close the disc cover.
- 4. Insert the game Controllers (and memory card if you have one).
- Turn ON the PlayStation game console. The introductory sequence will begin. To skip this sequence and go directly to the Main menu, press the START button.

Note: You will not be able to save your progress or game information if you don't use a memory card. Make sure there is at least one free block on your memory card before beginning your game in order to save games. You should not swap memory cards during play and you must leave the card in MEMORY CARD slot 1-A of your Multitap if you are using one.
